## How is Cononley Primary School Spending the Pupil Premium Grant 2016-2017?

We track the progress and attainment of all children in school, which enables us to provide additional targeted support for those pupils eligible for Pupil Premium Grant. This year we have used the funding to provide the following:

- Teaching Assistant Support for small groups and 1: 1 work to close the gap in attainment in Maths and English
- Higher Level Teaching Assistant support to release the class teacher to support individuals and small groups.
- Teaching Assistant to provide interventions to support language and communication skills
- Teaching Assistant to provide interventions to develop social and emotional skills
- Resources to support learning in Phonics and Reading
- Subsidising the cost of educational visits and out of school clubs and activities
- Contributing to SELFA (Skipton Extended Learning for All) to provide out of school clubs and holiday activities.
